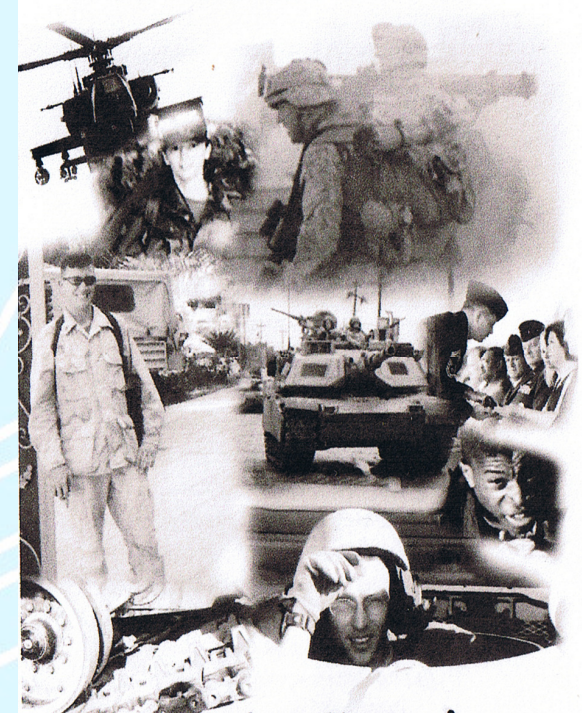

# PHOENIX SERVICES

## Community Integrated Rehabilitation

Phoenix Services offers the following services:

### Family Support Services:

People can best be supported when families have the resources and assistance necessary to keep the disabled family member in their own home.

- One-on-one support to the person and family in their own living, work, and/or school environment.
- Help building “natural supports” in the surrounding neighborhood and at the workplace (friends, supportive neighbors, co-workers, and local shop owners) for the person and the family.
- Family Education Services
- Instruction, supervision, and training to family members to understand and accommodate the special needs of tier family member.

### Behavior Support Services:

Behavior plans and supports are available as contracted at a bachelor’s or Master’s Level.

### Nurse Consultant:

We have a nurse consultant who provides medical information and supports to children and families as contracted.

### Interdisciplinary Team (IDT):

The IDT consists of Certified Brain Injury specialists, Nurse, Behavior Consultants, Speech and Cognitive Therapist, and an Occupational Therapy Consultant.

### Supported Living:

Many people with disabilities want to live independently in the community with the aid of specific supports. In addition to a variety of rehabilitative and companion services, Phoenix Services ensures that social opportunities in the community are an important part of the rehabilitation process.

- Find clean, safe, affordable housing
- Provide staff to spend a few hours each week to practice basic life skills (shopping, cooking, financial management).
- 24-hour staffing to help individuals with more server disabilities manage moods and behaviors so they can live safely in the community.

### Supported Employment:

Depending on the needs of the individual, a variety of employment supports are available.

- Phoenix Services job developers use their extensive network of contacts in the community to arrange hiring interviews and to carve out specific jobs that fie the person’s unique capabilities.
- Job coaches help the person learn job requirements and adjust to the new workplace.
- Job coaches also educate coworkers and supervisors to help them learn how to effectively incorporate the new member of the team.

Brain injury is a major health problem in civilian and military populations.

47.1% of all blast injuries affect the head. TBI can be moderate or sever depending on the extent of damage to the brain and subsequent level of wakefulness\*

25% of mild TBI patients develop a number of persistent symptoms post injury that vary greatly in severity and onset.\*

1.4 Million individuals sustain TBI annually resulting in 235,000 hospital admission and 50,000 deaths.\*

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
